However, hedgehogs can't fly, you may have noticed this, so to help them visit as many gardens as possible during their nocturnal ramblings it's helpful if you ensure that there is at least one hedgehog-friendly entry/exit route between your garden and a field or the garden next door. This doesn't need to be a big, a gap of about 15cm square is good, a little piece cut out of the bottom of a fencing panel or a piece snipped out of a wire fence – quick and easy and the hedgehogs will love you for it!
