News from the Village Hall

Improvements are slowly being made at the Village Hall and we are working our way through the developer contributions that we received through the s.106 payments.

It was agreed by the Village Hall Management Committee and the Community Infrastructure Levy Team (who administer this agreement) that we could spend the remaining funds in the outdoor sports area fund on refurbishing the Tennis Court at the Village Hall. We are delighted to let you know that work will begin on the Tennis Court w/c 28 October and is expected to take approximately 3 weeks (weather dependent). Once completed the new tennis court will have been resurfaced and re-painted to LTA standards with new netting and a wider gate making it accessible for wheelchair users.

In line with the refurbishment and upgrading of the court we will be increasing our hire fees from January 2025 to a fixed price of £6 per hour to cover maintenance.

The Village Hall also been looking at ways to save money and over the summer we cleared the hall of many items that have accumulated over the years. This enabled us to empty the container storage unit on the overflow car park and move items stored in there back into the Village Hall thus saving us a monthly hire charge.

As a consequence we have been looking for a new home for our Stage, which has not been used by the Village Hall for many, many years.

Ideally we would like to sell it to raise some funds but equally if there is anyone who would be happy to store it for future use by the community then please get in touch.



Fifteen humans and 2 dogs did the walk and 21 had a delicious lunch at the pub (they had to put up a notice to say it wasn't open for lunch, there were so many of us and we were in two rooms).

Weather forecasts predicted rain and storms but we were dry throughout the walk, the views were a little overcast but the sun came out towards the end of the walk. We started with a very steep climb up to the church which walkers took time to explore before braving the rest of the climb. We then walked up a less steep incline through fields of gorse on Woolland Hill up towards Bulbarrow, along the Wessex Ridgeway road. Unfortunately, both hedges and the mist meant we couldn't see the Blackmore Vale and then we started our descent towards Woolland past woods to our right. In Woolland we passed the home and studio of artist, Elizabeth Frink, then turned into a field of sycamores, crossing two footbridges under which the dogs enjoyed a swim and drink.

Compost Corner

We owe a lot to a father and son from the 17C, John Tradescant and his son....John Tradescant. They introduced dozens of plants from their travels round the world, many that are the mainstay of our gardens today and John, the elder created the first museum open to the public, showcasing his finds both botanical, zoological, historical and artistic for 6d a visit. It was also because of this extraordinary family that a beautiful church was saved from demolition.

St Mary-in-Lambeth is a church on the banks of the river Thames and the resting place of the Tradescants. However, a keen horticulturist, Rosemary Nicholson, was horrified to learn that the site was due for redevelopment in the early 1970s and managed to raise enough money to save the church and turn it into a museum not only celebrate the Tradescants but also garden history.

The inner courtyard, now known as The Sackler Garden (formerly a graveyard including the spectacular tomb of John Tradescant) was re-designed by the renowned Dan Pearson and is a delightful place to have lunch. It really is a fascinating museum and well worth a visit.
