## FULL FIBRE BROADBAND IS COMING TO FONTMELL MAGNA

Wessex Internet will be bringing full fibre broadband to Fontmell Magna with work having already started on putting the fibre network in place, with installations expected to start in November 2024.

Full fibre broadband offers a faster, more reliable internet connection and is part of a government funded project to offer an alternative to the existing copper network provided by OpenReach.

## GOOD NEWS FROM ST ANDREWS

If you have not attended one of our Church Breakfasts on the first Sunday of the month please do; good food and chat. One of our younger attendees thinks it's the "Best Church Breakfast Ever", thanks Olivia. Over July and August a series of repairs have been completed in the churchyard: the gate, archway and railings have been preserved and painted, the stone walls have been repaired, the path repaired and trees cut back (oh, and the wooden outside doors in the porch have been mended). As part of our 'living churchyard' the dead tree has been cut up and left as a 'bug hutch' and the edges of the grass are looking good with wild flowers. On the fabric front, it has been arranged that Colin Avery, stonemason, will start work on the repairs to the North Aisle pinnacles on 16 September. The work should take between 6-8 weeks to complete. During this time access to the churchyard and church will be unaffected, but please use common sense and take care if you go on the North side of the outside of the church near the scaffolding. On the fundraising side, the Friday morning coffee mornings continue to be popular and will now continue to be weekly in the church until the end of October (so long as the weather is mild), and over the winter will be held on a monthly basis is villagers' homes until returning to the Church in the Spring. A second lunchtime concert was well attended on 9 August (thank you Caroline D'Cruz and Charlotte Collier) and a huge thank you to Sian and Jim Highnam for hosting a lovely summer tea party and duck race in their lovely house and garden on 17 August, which raised around £660. I am also delighted to say that the Dorset Historic Churches Trust has awarded us a grant of £6000 towards our fabric repairs, thank you so much. Plans are starting for Christmas and 2025, the two big events hoped to be staged are a Christmas Tree Festival and a Summer Fete; both of which will need volunteers to help - more on that next month, but before then do contact me if you wish.
