From the Gossip Tree Committee

SEASONAL RECIPE—APPLE STRUDEL PIE

September is the month for lots of apples, so thanks to Katie for this recipe, a pastry base with delicious apples, dried fruit and cream filling with a crumble topping with cinnamon.

Filling

Pastry:

2lb cooking apples, peeled, cored &
Sliced—not too thinly
2oz raisins or sultanas
4oz plain flour
4oz caster sugar
2oz butter
10 fl oz double cream

Topping:

2 oz caster sugar

2 teaspoons cinnamon - or more to taste

You will need:

10" deep fluted lose bottom flan tin

To make pastry:

Sift flour and rub in the butter, sir in icing sugar and bind together with egg yolk and water.

Roll out the pastry thinly and line the tin

Filling:

Mix apples and raisins together. Sift flour and stir in the sugar and rub in the butter to make a crumble

Spoon half the crumble mixture into the pastry case.

Cover with the apples and raisins

Pour in the cream – all of it – don't be scared.

Spoon over the remaining rubbed in mixture and then sprinkle with the sugar and cinnamon mix.

Bake in a pre-heated oven 200C/Gas 6 for 25 minutes and then reduce the heat to 190/Gas 5 for a further 10 minutes.

If using cooking apples, you may want to leave it in for slightly longer.

Best to leave it to cool for a while until warm rather than piping hot.

Compost Corner

I remember on an Autumn holiday in The Swiss Alps seeing banks of beautiful pale mauve flowers on a mountain meadow; it was a dazzling sight. These delightful little plants were Colchicum also known as Autumn crocus, meadow saffron and naked ladies (like crocus they grow from corms) and if you take a closer look at them you'll notice that there are just spikes of flowers and no leaves, the leaves appear later. There are over 160 species of Colchicums and they thrive in well drained sunny conditions - a mountainside is ideal but we're a bit short of them in North Dorset, so a suitably located planter or an informal drift in grass would be just fine.

True crocus corms should be planted now. These too grow wild over wide swathes of Europe, some are suitable for rock gardens and others thrive if naturalised in grass and there's a huge selection from which to choose. A few RHS AGM varieties include Crocus tommasinianus ('Ruby Giant' has large rich purple flowers)

and one of the earliest flowering varieties, Crocus imperati. Crocus vernus is another native of Switzerland (known as Dutch crocus) can be seen poking up through the melting alpine snow. And of course there are many species of crocus that do indeed flower in the autumnhorticulture is a confusing business. Alison Main

Guide Dog Puppy Training – Nesta August 2020

We have a new Guide Dog puppy, Nesta, a Labrador/ Retriever cross. She has been with us since the end of June and is a year old. Covid 19 had an impact on Nesta's original puppy walker family and they were unable to continue her training. Unfortunately she's had several changes of home since lockdown, however she settled quickly with us and is here to stay. We would expect to continue her basic training for around a further 6 months before she moves on to advanced training at one of the national centres, probably Southampton.

The lockdown has affected much of the work of Guide Dogs including the national breeding programme, the placement of qualified dogs with new permanent owners and fundraising activities.

We are now allowed back in shops, but not yet on public transport. Nesta and I will be out and about each day and planning to add new experiences as restrictions ease.

Nesta is friendly, willing and inquisitive. She is generally well-mannered and quick to follow commands. She can be bouncy and barky and at present she's a terror for picking up and chewing all manner of stuff from the pavement! Work in progress

Tilly: Our previous puppy, Tilly, has completed her training at Leamington Spa. She has been "matched" with her new owner. The Guide Dogs trainer will work daily with both dog and owner for the first few weeks to establish Tilly's working and care regime.
