

Fontmell Magna Parish Council

Minutes of the Emergency Parish Council meeting held on Monday 5th September 2022 at 7.45pm in the Village Hall.

Present: Cllrs A Davis (Chair AD) M Humphreys (MH) A Main (AM) L Kurton (LM) & C Scott (CS). In Attendance: S Smith (Clerk) and 3 members of the public.

Apologies for absence: None, all PC Cllrs present.

Bench & Picnic Bench at Middle Mill: The PC agreed to purchase the new bench and picnic table for siting at Middle Mill. One of these is a memorial bench for the late Gary Payne. The benches will be for residents use but remain the responsibility/property of the PC.

Letter to FM Public Amenity Site Trust: AD has put together a letter addressed to the to The Trust to confirm the bench arrangement. The Trust has agreed to donate £3,000 to Parish Council funds. All Cllrs agreed to this. The confirmation letter was signed by AD and the Clerk and handed to Dick Stainer. A cheque for £3,000 was given to the Clerk by DS. AD thanked the trustees of the FM Public Amenity Site Trust for arranging for the new bench and table, which will enhance residents and visitors experience when visiting the Middle Mill and the Wildlife Reserve.

Matters Arising from Councillors/Clerk:

Clerk – the Clerk stated that she would like to undertake the CILCA qualification. The course commences in November 2022. The total signing up cost is £645.00 but this amount can be split between Parish Councils. All Cllrs agreed that it would be advantageous for the Clerk to undertake this qualification. A qualified Clerk would give the PC the 'general power of competence' which would allow the PC to undertake more advanced activities.

LK – raised the issue of a lack of bus stop at the new Spring Meadows development and access to the main village for the less abled. This issue has been raised by existing residents and also by a potential new resident. Cllr Jane Somper is taking the issue further with Highways. LK suggested a bus stop at the turning circle within the development.

Welcome pack – LK has been talking to Ann Hobbs re the village Welcome Pack. The emergency plan and business directory need to be added. Ann had asked LK about re imbursement for the printing costs. The PC offered to purchase Ann some paper and ink for this purpose. Producing a printed cover folder was discussed as project for the future.

AM – the dog waste bin has not yet been replaced at Middle Mill; it looks like a concrete base will need to be laid first. It appears that nobody is responsible for the dog bin behind the school, but this bin is being currently emptied. Pennyfarthing Homes have offered to install another dog bin by the new development, the cost of emptying it will mostly likely have to be meet by the PC.

CS – the battery in the defibrillator will be replaced soon.

AD – stated that efforts are being made to try to improve the acoustics in the short term at Village Hall with the use of partitions, etc.

Date of Next Meeting: 4th October 2022 in the Village Hall starting at 7.00pm (delayed from 21st September due to the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II).

All of you who have visited Middle Mill dam site in the last month will have seen the new concrete plinths. These was prepared with the invaluable assistance of Gordon Gosling who kindly provided a concrete mixer and mixed all the concrete for the plinths on one very warm evening in August. A week later the memorial bench was delivered and installed by Richard Jesse from Sixpenny Forge.

A brass plate has been commissioned inscribed to the memory of Gary Payne with a short dedication to him.



All that remains is to fix the plate on the bench and hold an informal ceremony to remember Gary, the work that he did for the community and the Middle Mill dam site in particular.

This will take place on Saturday the 8th of October at 12:00 midday and anyone wishing to come along will be very welcome.

On Saturday 17th September 2022, in FM Village hall, eight new students joined Kim Creswell – (Tutor) to complete a pig sculptured from willow. This is the second workshop to be run exclusively in the Village Hall. The day was a success. All followed Kim's lead, first making the frame for the body, then intertwining willow to strengthen the frame. The afternoon concentrated on completing the weaving effect of head and ears. Kim grows and supplies all materials. The willow is prepared after a long soak. The sculptures need a few days to dry, a couple of coats of Danish oil or similar before going into the garden on display.

- Linda said the workshop was great, wish we had longer to finish them properly. Kim is a fantastic teacher and willow 'sculpturist'.

Everyone was deeply engrossed and focused on their sculpture. Kim gives one to one attention at each stage. NO experience needed – if you have never weaved willow before it can feel daunting. The pigs still needed some finishing so Kim sent everyone home with enough willow to finish the sculpture, the techniques already embedded to memory and practice through the day.

We will negotiate another date for the spring. A sculpture yet to be decided on but one that is ideal for a beginner. 
