Our first film of the Autumn season will be "The Duke" showing on Wednesday 14th September in the village hall. The film stars Helen Mirren and Jim Broadbent and is based on the true story when in 1961 a London taxi driver stole Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery to hold the government to ransom until they invested more in the care of the elderly.

Doors and the bar open at 7pm and the film starts at 7.30.

Tickets are on sale now at the village shop £6.50 or £7 on the door.

Councillor's Chronicles No.11 - Defibrillator at the Ready

The Parish Council is responsible for keeping a watchful eye on the village defibrillator, which for those of you who may not be aware, is positioned on the front wall of St Andrews School, directly in front of you as you enter the car park.

A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy electric shock to the patient which is called defibrillation and is an essential part in trying to save the life of someone who is in cardiac arrest.

Although there are courses for their use with St John's Ambulance Service, the instructions for use are on the machine and are very clear and easy to understand.





It is monitored on a monthly basis by a member of the Parish Council. It was brought to our attention recently that the date appearing on the front of the defibrillator was August 2022 which led some to believe that meant it needed a new battery but we have been assured by the suppliers that is not the case. They do not come out to automatically change the batteries until the green light turns red and even then it will carry on working for several weeks more.

There is another defibrillator at Bedchester crossroads, in the telephone box, but that is monitored separately.

Of course, none of us want the situation to arise where it needs to be used but it is reassuring to know there is one in the village. If an opportunity arises where we can have a second one close by we will inform residents straight away.

Meet Titan, a self-seeded, gatecrasher to my party in the front garden of 66 West Street, FM. This plant has caused traffic obstruction, intrigue, surprise and wonder. Many have stopped to take a picture or exclaim 'Look at the sunflower' as they pass by. Children on have exclaimed 'WOW'. A driver the other day slowed down to call out 'impressive'!

Titan appeared in the spring tucked in beside the Salvia that was growing with promise. The new beds of carefully tendered perennials had been planted out in the autumn. The

homemade compost is from where this intruder emerged. The flower head is now turning in on itself. The bees gorged earlier in the season and next the greenfinches will perch undisturbed to feast on this fare. It now measures 7'4" in height, the seed head is 17" Diameter and 6" circumference trunk. If you look closely there are thousands of small insects tucked in and under the leaves and flowers.

I anticipate discovering it upturned from the great weight of the seed head. It does look like the largest satellite around Saturn. For now, I am savouring it as the seeds mature until they are harvested for bird food and be given away for propagating next year. Titan a colossus, leviathan means one of great strength and power.

Look out for son of Titan 2023.

Compost Corner


