# Compost Corner

Hostas are a great addition to the garden but are notorious for being a favourite meal for our mollusc friends. But this year, I can honestly say that I have two perfect, completely hole-less hostas. So how on earth have I achieved this? Well, they're sitting in our pond, raised up on bricks and completely out of reach of voracious slugs and snails. There are various pond snails but these seem to prefer slimy algae to tasty hosta leaves. I lost a lot of plants last winter, but despite the pond being completely frozen over, it didn't affect these hostas at all and now in summer having a ready supply of water means they never dry out. But what if you don't have a pond? Use a water filled bowl put a hosta in the middle raised up on some stones and they'll be safe from marauding wildlife. Alison Main
