On Saturday, 26 August, over 60 members of the community gathered at The Fontmell Pub to thank Rick and Jan Attfield for their 11 years' service at the Fontmell Magna village shop & Post Office.

Pen Hadow, speaking on behalf of the whole village, paid a warm tribute to Rick and Jan commending their time, effort and commitment in providing the village with a much valued local service. In particular he thanked them for the exceptional services they provided during the pandemic and lockdown; services that were much appreciated throughout the community and indeed a lifeline for some.

Pen also thanked them for their fortitude and perseverance during the 4 years that the Fontmell Magna Community Land Trust took to bring the ownership of the shop premises into safer hands. He said that the successful completion of that acquisition in July 2022, funded equally by the community and the Government's 'Community Ownership Fund', cleared the way for all the repairs and maintenance needed given the previous landlord's woeful neglect of the property. At the same time

the shop lease was restructured to support the shop business. These measures have secured the future of our important community asset, the village shop, post office and café - so very nearly lost.

As we say thank you to Rick and Jan and wish them well for the future, we look forward to the next chapter in the story of our village shop.

She has worked really hard to reorganise this new kitchen and many of you will be pleased to hear she has labelled the cupboards and drawers as a few of you requested so it's easier to find everything.

We have instructions on how to use the sound system and hearing loop available for all users, please just ask when booking should you wish to use it. The acoustic clouds are being installed mid-September and we think you will really notice the difference at speaker events.

Now to the playground, thank you to everyone for your patience with this, especially the children. Due to the hard work of our Chairman, Rosie-Anne and one of our Trustees, Derek and various contractors along the way, we have a perfectly levelled grassy area on which the new playground will stand. The aim is to start the installation process early October, sooner if possible.

The responsibility for the playground is remaining with the Village Hall so we will be re-launching the Playground Appeal this Autumn to fundraise for its continuing maintenance. We would like to thank the many villagers who supported our previous fundraising events over the past 5 years and those who donated large sums to this project. Thanks to your support and generosity we have managed, together with developer s106 contributions, to finally commission a playground that will last for many years to come and bring great joy to all the under 12's and their parents and carers. The final project at the Village Hall will be the refurbishment of the Ladies and Gents loos which is scheduled for January 2024.

Dear Supporter

Gillingham Foodbank has been serving the Blackmore Vale and surrounding areas since December 2011. During that period, we have helped literally thousands of local people in crisis to get back on their feet. Not only do we offer help with food, household cleaning items, toiletries and utilities, but also access to benefits, debt and housing advice to ensure the best chance of alleviating poverty.

The cost-of-living crisis, experienced by us all, has led to a huge increase in demand for Foodbank services – 67% more people were provided with emergency food last year than in the previous one. Sadly, food donations have not kept pace with this demand, indeed they have fallen in volume, and we are now having to regularly purchase specific items to cover the shortfall.

As a valued supporter, we would be very grateful for any donations to Gillingham foodbank to help us provide our emergency parcels to local people in need.

We regularly update our website: www.gillingham.foodbank.org.uk/donate with a list of specific needs, plus we use a phone app called BanktheFood, available for Android and Apple smartphones, to assist shoppers wishing to purchase food for the foodbank.

Our current shortages are as follows:

- · Biscuits, Instant potato mash, Jam, Pasta Sauce, Packet rice (500g), Tinned meat, stews, etc
- · Tinned potatoes, Tinned soup, Tinned vegetables, Tomato ketchup (small)
- · Sweet treats, chocolate, UHT fruit juice, UHT semi-skinned milk

We are so grateful to all our donors for the support you give to the foodbank; without you we just wouldn't be able to do what we do.

Compost Corner

One of the delights of a visit to coastal Cornwall in summer is the spectacle of seeing masses of sky blue agapanthus in gardens, fields, along roadsides verges - they're everywhere. These are the evergreen agapanthus which originally came from South Africa and sometimes known as Lily of the Nile or African Lily. They cope well with the salty air, are very low maintenance and drought tolerant, but are not hardy. I had a huge pot of them but because it was so heavy I left it outside over winter. After some very cold weather, all the leaves died and the mass of roots turned to a disgusting, smelly mush and the whole lot had to be chucked away.

The deciduous varieties are a different matter altogether and can safely be planted out and shouldn't be a problem. There are all sorts to choose from as well: white, shades of blue and purple, some with variegated leaves and the flowers last for weeks on end. Once flowering is over, leave the

decorative seed heads until winter's weather finally defeats them.
