# **IVWG Walk Child Okeford December 2023**

For our Christmas walk, we set off from Gold Hill Organic Farm with 11 humans and 4 dogs, including a guide dog in training, past the many polytunnels, through a copse with a stream, up towards Hambledon Hill, to a stone circle (created last century) with alpacas. The walk was only 2.5 miles long, a choice for this colder time of year. We were lucky to have a dry day amongst a week of much rain and there were some muddy bits including a slurry pit on the way back, but fortunately it wasn't the kind of mud that cakes up your boots and this was only a small part of the walk. We had a delicious lunch in the Gold Hill Organic Kitchen, joined by two other walking group members. It's not possible to book a table so we took a chance and ate quite early to avoid the crowds.







#### **HOMESTART—BLACKMORE VALE**

My name is Sue Morgan and I moved to Fontmell Magna with my husband Jeff in September 2019. Before Christmas that year I contacted a charity called Home Start. At that time the scheme covered North Dorset, but in 2022-3 the organisation expanded into south Somerset and renamed to become Home Start Blackmore Vale (HSBV). The first Home-Start began 50 years ago, and there are now over 180 schemes across the UK. Home-Start has helped more than 1.5 million families nationally. After completing the training, volunteers commit 2-3 hours each week to work with a family who have at least one child under 5, where their parenting experience, support, kindness, and care has been proved to help transform the lives of parents and their children. Home-Start Blackmore Vale has helped over 750 families in the last 12 years. In 2022 I was invited to become a Trustee and I now represent the volunteer perspective on that Board of Directors for HSBV. I am still supporting families and over the last 4 years I have supported six families all with varying needs, but mostly I offer a listening ear.

Why do I do this? As a healthcare professional in my working life I wanted to continue to use those skills as a retiree. There are many rewards and over a period of 3-6 months of visiting a family they can name a difference – the philosophy is to help the children at a critical time in their development. HSBV provides other support strategies with a Playgroup, Mothers in Mind – a Perinatal Support group and recently a School Readiness programme. In the picture you can see Jamie Keast (L) a Scheme Co-ordinator with the Scheme Manager - Chelsey Gowen. There are six other employees in the scheme who work varied hours to cover the administration, training and supervision of approximately 50+ volunteers, who in turn support a growing number of families referred to HSBV locally. HSBV is overseen by the Trustees, who are also volunteers. This role is new to me and I have learnt so much in the last two years about charities, how they operate and constantly need to fundraise to provide the revenue to maintain all of the above.

The biggest reward in both voluntary roles is to have met so many people in the area like Chelsey, Jamie and the rest of the team who support me. My Trustee colleagues and Carole – Chair of the Board meet bi monthly and I welcome their experience, wisdom and skill to oversee a successful and strong branch of this national charity. The volunteer army, my peers - all so like-minded in making a commitment and we support each other when we come to training each year. Most importantly, meeting the families who have all needed different things from me. The involvement with them has been truly positive and humbling.

The charity is looking to recruit past or new volunteers with parenting experience, to commit to two or three hours per week to help parents and children in the community. If you would like to get involved, please contact us. Training will be provided, and no special qualifications are needed. Fontmell Magna is rich with new residents, and I am sure there are those amongst you looking for that opportunity to participate in voluntary work in your local area.

We are currently recruiting for new trustees and a Chair of Trustees. The current chair Carole Brown is standing down after more than a decade devoted to the charity. So indirectly taking on a voluntary role to support a charity – so vital we have recruits.


#### Compost Corner

We are a nation of bird lovers: we spend about £250 million on bird food, over half a million of us participate in the annual Great British Bird Watch, we put up nest boxes, provide birdbaths and get up at daybreak on Dawn Chorus day.

I have a selection of bird boxes in our garden:- a multi hole terrace for gregarious sparrows, open fronted ones for robins and wrens and a selection of standard boxes for any one who fancies them. But the tragic fact is that last year not one of them was occupied; all I saw in the one which had a camera was a nice cobweb - not exactly riveting. But we do have a very healthy number of birds visiting our garden, even a moorhen which I saw perched up a Rowan tree. So what am I doing wrong? I admitted this sad fact to a friend who astutely observed that the absence of nest box residents is probably because we have plenty of natural nesting sites. Hurrah - I'm not being ostracised by our feathered friends

after all but maybe they have found just what they need hither, thither and yon in some of the wilder corners of the garden and in the trees we've planted here. Perhaps, this year, if I'm really lucky, I'll see a spider by the cobweb in the camera nest box. Can't wait!
