FABRIC PROGRESS AT ST ANDREW'S

Things have moved along since our Village meeting on 1 March. The good news is that the PCC now has sufficient funds in its 'fabric fund' to give the green light to the stonemason to start the work on the North Aisle parapets and pinnacles. It is hoped that this work will be completed this summer (the stonemason cannot work with lime mortars during the cold months, so the work will need to be completed by October ideally). The PCC has reached this position thanks to a £9,000 grant from the Erskine Muton Trust; the rest coming from generous donations from many within the St Andrew's community. We have applied to one other grant-giving trust, the Dorset Historic Churches Trust and are in touch with others with regard to the next stage of work to re-lead the South Aisle roof. Many thanks to David Fangen and Roger Thomas for leading on these grant applications. A full programme of fundraising started on 20 April with money raised at two stalls at the Village Spring Fair (approximately £300) and half the retiring collection from the Dick Jones Memorial Concert (approximately £500), both going to the Fabric Fund.

Iwerne Valley Walking Group—Saturday 16th March 2024

Nine walkers and two dogs set out for a four mile circular walk around Melbury Wood, off the airfield road. The wood is notable for being comprised almost entirely of mature beech trees, with not a conifer in sight for the extent of our walk, and plenty of wild garlic beginning to come through. The outward track was muddy but passable and the return journey was through the trees along the ridge where we came across a herd of deer grazing in the field alongside the wood. Afterwards, we met up with some non-walking members at The Fontmell and all had a thoroughly enjoyable lunch.

Compost Corner

What do you think is most expensive, one kg of: topside beef, Jerusalem artichokes, rocket or fresh ginger? Answer: Rocket

Generally, supermarket herbs and salads are incredibly expensive to buy but a pack of hundreds of seeds will only cost only a pound or two.

There are two main types of rocket: wild rocket (Diplotaxis tenulifolia, a perennial) and salad rocket (Eruca versicaria, an annual). There are several varieties of each type of rocket available; some are hotter and more peppery than others. One annual variety called 'Scorpian' is particularly fiery and marketed as having 'a sting in its tail'.

Sow seeds outdoors from April to early September, keep well watered in dry weather and protect from slugs and snails. Flea beetles can cause cosmetic problems munching little holes in the leaves, but the leaves can still be harvested even though they look less than perfect. Spraying with a pesticide is not recommended but an insect proof mesh can be used to cover the plants which may keep the beetles out.

Whichever variety of rocket you choose, it will make an excellent pesto, an addition to soup, in hummus and frittata or simply as part of a summer salad.
